



QUEENSLAND TWITCHATHON

22 SEPTEMBER to 3 OCTOBER 2023

Rules and Conditions

NOTE: Teams will need to observe the COVID-19 Government restrictions and distancing rules in force at the time. This may involve things such as limiting the number of people in a vehicle not from the same family group. Wearing face masks, not sharing food and drink, regular hand washing/sanitising etc.

1. Birding Area

The birding area is confined to the state of Queensland.

2. Birds Counted

To be counted, birds must be alive, unrestrained and from recognised, free-living established populations.

3. Species Counted

The International Ornithological Committee's (IOC) Australian Checklist is the taxonomy to be used by participating teams. A copy of this list can be found at the link in section 14. Species must be recognised by sight or sound by more than 50% of the team, and team members must be in visual contact at the time a species is counted.

4. Teams

Teams must have a minimum of two members, with one nominated leader. **Each team must contain at least one member of Birds Qld OR Birdlife Australia.** All team members must participate for the duration of time prescribed for that category.

5. Categories

A winning team will be announced for each of the following categories. The winning team is the one that records the highest total of species under the conditions prescribed for that category. The prescribed conditions are:

- **Open Category:** Birds may be counted during any **continuous period** of **24 hours** between 5.30 am on Friday, 22 September and 10 pm on Tuesday 3 October. Transport may be by any mode except aircraft.
- **Champagne Category:** Birds may be counted during any **continuous period** of **12 hours** between 5.30 am on Friday 22 September and 10 pm on Tuesday 3 October, which must include an obligatory stop of not less than 1 hour, plus at least two other 30 minute stops. The complete 12 hour period must occur between 5.30am and 10pm. Walking and birding is permitted at the obligatory stops, but not travel between sites.
- **Eco Category:** Birds may be counted during any **continuous period** of **12 hours** between 5.30 am on Friday 22 September and 10 pm on Tuesday 3 October. Once the period of 12 hours has commenced, any form of motorised transport is prohibited, except public transport and mobility scooters and electric (e) bicycles/scooters/personal mobility devices (however, where e - bicycles/scooters/personal mobility devices are used these must not be modified and must be speed restricted as per the current state rules). At least one member of the team must be using a non e - bicycle/scooter/personal mobility device.

Individuals may compete in more than one category, but not concurrently.

Depending upon the number of registrations received, sub-categories may be created in any or all three of the above categories. These sub-categories may include;

- Youngest average team age / Oldest average team age
- Team with the average least number of previous Twitchathons between members
- Team with most members who have never competed in a Twitchathon
- Most species in a particular region
- Most species by public transport / Most species by bicycle / Most species by wheelchair/mobility scooter
- Most species by non-motorised water craft / Most species on foot
- Greatest / least distance travelled during the Twitchathon

- Greatest / least distance from “home” (eg; walked to local park or drove to Bowra prior to start)
- Most species in a particular group (eg: raptors, shorebirds etc)

6. Registrations

Teams must register prior to conducting their twitch. Registrations open on **Tuesday 1 August 2023**, and are open until **Wednesday 20 September 2023**. (Late entries may be accepted at the discretion of the Twitchathon Co-ordinator up until 48 hours prior to the day of the team’s proposed twitch).

7. Outside Assistance

During the Twitchathon, teams may not seek assistance in finding birds from non-participants or online sources. Any information received prior to the commencement of the Twitchathon may be used.

8. Ethics

No recorded calls or mechanical devices may be used to attract birds, and disturbance must be kept to a minimum. Other teams must not be obstructed. Teams that have trespassed during the Twitchathon will be disqualified.

9. Safety

The rules of the road must be observed, and any team booked for traffic offences during the Twitchathon will be disqualified. Care should be taken to change or rest drivers every two hours.

10. Results

Team leaders must report their species total by email, text or phone before 8pm, Wednesday 4 October. A list of the species counted must be received by email or post before 8pm, Friday 6 October 2023. Results will be announced by Friday 13 October. Contact details for submitting results are included at section 14.

Details for sub-categories should also be emailed with the species list (eg: distance travelled during the Twitchathon 24/12 hrs, distance travelled prior to start and after the finish).

Along with the results, please also advise what you felt to be your “best” bird, biggest “dip” and any other interesting details that can be included in the post-twitch write-up.

11. Prizes

- Highest Individual Fundraiser: A plaque on the Dollarbird Trophy plus a bottle of wine (or equivalent).
- Highest Team Fundraiser: Each team member wins a bottle of wine (or equivalent).
- Winning Team Open Category: A plaque on the Queensland Twitch Champions (Paradise Parrot) Trophy plus each team member wins a bottle of wine (or equivalent).
- Winning Team Eco Category: Each team member wins a bottle of wine (or equivalent).
- Winning Team Champagne Category: Each team member wins a bottle of wine (or equivalent).
- Certificates will be presented for Category and Sub-category winners.

12. Sponsorship & Fundraising

The Queensland Twitchathon is a fundraising event conducted by Birds Queensland to support the research and conservation of Queensland’s birds. Sponsorships will be split between the research projects being supported by Birds Queensland and research projects with Birdlife Australia Southern Queensland. **To be eligible for prizes, a team must raise at least \$50 per person.** All donations of \$2 or more are tax deductible.
